Mr. Wintle described the Northern Adapted Sports Association (NASA) wheelchair basketball program that came to the school district last week. All grade 4, 5 and 8 students, and some grade 3 students, participated. The program is a good example of Universal Design for Learning as it levelled the playing field for all participants. Use of a wheelchair proved to be a great way for students to work with their upper body muscles. Staff involvement was appreciated by the students. Trustees shared the reaction they heard from students, who were engaged and very enthusiastic about their participation.
