Trail walks and the trail markers/signs in both languages provided great learning opportunities for the students. They had done their research prior to attending so when they attended the different areas they were able to connect with the history/culture. Impressed with the high school and the indigeneity from the ground up. It was a success and a transformative learning experience. Trustees thanked Nancy took the initiative and did this.
